

BARGAINING UPDATE

Our First Day of Bargaining is Done! We Are Ready to Stand Together

We are united across St. Clare Hospital for a contract with significant improvements for our work, our patients and our families. We kicked off bargaining discussing the issues that matter most to us, including staffing and respect for the work we do.

Our proposals from the first day:

- Make it easier to create new FTEs where management is trying to fill holes with agency workers
- Create a faster pathway for per diem coworkers to apply for an FTE when the schedules they are working are not covering sick, vacation or other leave for regular positions
- Respect for the training, orienting, and precepting work we do
- Recognition of past experience with year for year credit and an audit for anyone who believes they should be at a higher pay step



Our next bargaining date is August 13.

Over **1,100** healthcare workers in the service, professional, and technical bargaining units right here at Virginia Mason Medical Center in Seattle are currently negotiating the first ever union contract! They are advocating for improved wages, better staffing, benefits, and respect in the workplace.

Since October, over 600 Service and LPN members at St. Joseph Medical Center in Tacoma have been fighting for livable wages, better staffing, and workplace safety.

Additionally, over 80 healthcare workers in service and technical units at VMFH

Rehabilitation Hospital in Tacoma have recently passed proposal priority votes to fight for improved wages, better staffing, benefits, and transparency in the workplace as they work towards securing a first contract.

Over **300** healthcare workers in service and technical units at VMFH St. Clare Hospital in Lakewood had our first day of bargaining to fight for improved wages, better staffing, benefits, and respect in the workplace. (That's us!)





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
